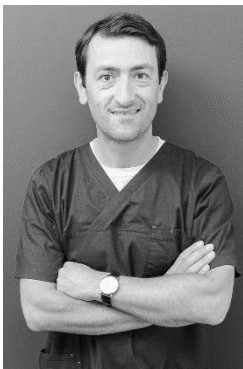

Jérôme Lasserre graduated as a dentist in 2001 at the Catholic University of Louvain, Brussels, Belgium. He then spent two years at the University Denis Diderot (PARIS 7), Paris, France where he obtained his Implantology degree and certificates in Biomaterials and Periodontology. Back in Belgium in 2003, he followed a complementary three years full time certificate in Periodontics and Oral Implantology at the Catholic University of Louvain in the department of professor Bercy and graduated as a certified periodontist in 2006. He presented his PhD thesis in 2016 on the evaluation of new strategies to control dental biofilms and related diseases under the supervision of professor M. Brex.

He is currently clinical professor and lecturer since 2009 in the department of periodontology headed by the professor S. Toma at the Saint-Luc University hospital, Brussels, Belgium (Université catholique de Louvain). His clinical practice is exclusively dedicated to implantology, muco-gingival surgery and periodontology. His main scientific research activities focus on alveolar ridge preservation, bone regeneration and management of infectious peri-implant disease.

Finally, he is also fellow and lecturer of the International Team for Implantology (ITI) and has been an active member in the board of the Belgian Society of Periodontology (BSP) from 2009 to 2016.

Drs. Lorenz Seyssens graduated from Ghent University in 2019. Thereafter, he gained experience as a restorative dentist in multidisciplinary practices and started a PhD-program in Oral Surgery. In 2023, he will complete his three-year residency in Periodontics and Oral Implantology at Ghent University.

His clinical and scientific focus has been implant placement in the esthetic zone as well as hard and soft tissue regeneration. The last few years, he has published extensively in this field and he is involved in the peer-review process of international journals in periodontics and oral surgery.
